

Overdose of Opioids with Xylazine



Restored breathing, NOT wakefulness, is the most important sign to look for when responding to a xylazine involved overdose.

How To: Rescue Breathing 1) Put the person flat on their back. 2) Tilt the chin back, ensuring the airway is clear. If not, clear using two fingers as a hook. 3) Pinch their nose and place your mouth over theirs, giving two steady breaths. 4) Continue with one breath every 5 seconds.

How To: Recovery Position

1) Start with the person flat on their back, keeping the left arm and leg straight.

2) Bend their right leg and roll them onto their left side.

3) Place their head on the left arm and bend the right arm in front to keep them from rolling over.
